Lost homework books will require replacing at a cost of 50p for the orange exercise books, £2 for the school diary and up to £4.99 for the Maths and English work books.

Targets

We have now completed all baseline assessments and are busy setting targets for this year for each child. As soon as this is completed, all families will receive conformation of the targets that have been set for their child this year.

<u>Uniform</u>

It is expected that all children are in full school uniform and that this includes PE kit. Letters have been sent home already detailing any incorrect uniform and regular checks will continue. At this stage, given that some small changes have been made to the uniform, as detailed in the letters, parents are asked to replace the items that are wrong with the correct items, when their children grow out of them.
