

Year 1 & 2: Summer Term



Maths

The children will remain in their normal classes for mathematics. We will be following our Mastery approach whereby all children can access Maths through support and concrete resources. In both year groups, we will be focusing on the fundamentals of Maths:

Year 1

- Multiplication and Division
- Fractions
- Position and Direction
- Place Value within 100
- Money
- Time

Year 2

- Fractions
- Time
- Statistics
- Position and Direction



Writing

We will be following Write Stuff programme, which exposes children to a variety of genres, letting he children write for different purposes. This term we will be using the story George and the dragon to write a narrative. We will also be using On Safari as our nonfiction text.



Reading

Every morning, the children will be learning to read through our successful Read Write Inc programme, which is the same as the previous academic year. The children will be split into smaller groups to ensure they get the correct provision needed to become fluent readers.

At the end of every day, the children will read a story chosen from the year 1 and 2 Pie Corbet reading spines which will encourage reading for pleasure and the teacher will model fluent and expressive reading.

We will continue to promote that the children read three times a week to a parent/carer at home and once per week to teaching staff.

History

<u>Animal Survival –</u>



Art -

Portraits and Poses

This project teaches children about portraiture. They analyse the portraits of Tudor monarchs and compare Tudor portraits and selfies today. They use photo editing software to create royal portraits.



<u>Design & Technology – Remarkable</u> <u>Recipes</u>

This project teaches children about fabric home products and the significant British brand Cath Kidston. They learn about sewing patterns and using a running stitch and embellishments before making a sewn bag tag.

Music

In music this academic year, Year 2 will have the fantastic opportunity of learning a musical instrument named Tootes (these are a cross breed between a recorder and a flute).

Year1 will be learning how to listen and appraise, sing, perform, compose, improvise and play an instrument. The songs are: the Friendship song and Reflect, Rewind, Replay.

Our focus is health and well-being which focuses on

<u>PE</u>

The children will be learning fielding and striking skills and how to apply these to different games. They will also be learning athletics, which includes a range of activities such as long jump and hurdles.



RE

Anand Karaj- Anand Karaj is a Sikh wedding. On the morning of the wedding, the bride and groom's family meet at the Gurdwara and share food before the ceremony. The Granthi leading the service recites prayers and hymns.
